## App Setup

Here's how to get the Lynda.com app on your smartphone or tablet. Lynda.com can be used on devices running iOS 8.1 and up, Android 4.1 and up and Windows 8 and up.

1. Go to the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store on your device and search for "Lynda". Select **Lynda.com**.
2. Install the Lynda app. You may be asked for your Apple or Google password.
3. After the password is entered, the Lynda app will install. Open the app on your device.
4. Tap the **Already a Lynda member?** button.
5. Tap **Organization** in the upper right.
6. In the **Web Portal** field, type [www.columbuslibrary.org](http://www.columbuslibrary.org) then tap **Sign in**.
7. You'll be taken to Lynda.com in your browser. Enter your CML library card number and PIN and tap **Sign in**. (If you're asked if you wish to open it in the Lynda.com app, tap **Open** to do so.)
8. From here you can see what's popular and browse the course offerings to choose what you'd like to learn about. Use the menu button in the upper left to see your courses and settings.
